President Ashcraft called to order the regular session of the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District Board of Directors at 1:06 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance

Fire Chief (Retired) Mike Lowry led the assembly in the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

2. Special Presentations

a. Badge Presentation

Chief Michel summarized the recruitment selection process for the Fire Marshal position. He presented Marlene Donner her Fire District badge. President Ashcraft on behalf of the Board of Directors offered congratulations to her and wished continued success in her new role.

b. Certificate of Recognition

Chief Michel recapped a significant call that occurred on March 28, 2017 that resulted in a life-saving CPR. A Certificates of Recognition was presented to Firefighter/Paramedic Chase Cantrell for his off-duty leadership, skill, and actions taken while performing life-savings efforts to a citizen.

3. Public Comment

Chief Mike Lowry expressed his appreciation to the Board of Directors for the opportunity to serve as the interim Fire Marshal.

a. None

6. New Business

a. Use of RSF6 Facilities

Chief Michel informed the Board that the Elfin Forest Harmony Grove Town Council has used RSF6 (prior to the reorganization) for several years in support of the annual 4th of July activities. The Town Council made a request to continue the use of the fire station for the 4th of July event that includes a designated area for a "beer garden." He requested that the board provide staff the necessary direction or approval of this request. Staff responded to questions from the Board.

At the conclusion of the discussion, it was agreed that the Elfin Forest/Harmony Grove Town Council could continue to use RSF6, with the appropriate insurance requirements, and an agreement, that is reviewed and approved by the District's legal counsel, which includes "hold harmless" language.

MOTION BY DIRECTOR STINE, SECOND BY DIRECTOR TANNER, CARRIED 4 AYES; 0 NOES; 1 ABSENT; 0 ABSTAIN to authorize the use of the RSF6 location for the 4th of July activities, and further authorized the Fire Chief to execute the agreement.

b. *Tentative Map 5081 – Improvements*

Chief Michel reported that this matter was requested for removal from the agenda at the request of legal counsel. The Board of Directors agreed to the request. There was no discussion or action taken on this topic.

7. Oral Report

- a. Fire Chief Michel
 - Meeting with Finance Committee: he reported that staff had participated in the first round of budget discussions. The current fiscal year received significant one time revenue that will significantly affect

the District's financials. He requested a meeting with the Finance Committee and staff to discuss the topic. A meeting will be set for late April/early May.

 Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Design/Build Services for RSF5: the RFQ closes Monday, April 17, 2017.

b. Operations – Deputy Chief

Chief Cox summarized the previous month's activity, noting district personnel responded to 290 incidents. He discussed the recent CPR save in the Rancho Diegueno area and noted that CSA-17 has an overall save rate of 19%, noting that the national average is approximately 5%.

c. Elfin Forest Volunteer Division – Division Chief

Chief Twohy reported on a community presentation on fire prevention. The integration continues to make progress. There are new plans to create a new mentoring program that pairs a career professional with a volunteer for one 24-hour shift. In addition, volunteer and firefighter personnel plan to attend a conference for combination departments.

d. Training – Battalion Chief

Chief Cox reported that personnel participated in blue card training, a new EMS reporting software, and probationary testing.

e. Fire Prevention - Fire Marshal

Fire Marshal Donner reported that the staff has been very busy with inspections at The Inn at Rancho Santa Fe. Another project that is taking a lot of the inspector's time is the tenant improvements at Cymer. Staff is also preparing for the annual mailing of weed abatement letters. Harmony Grove Village homes are selling and a new phase of construction is planned for this summer.

f. Administrative Manager

Ms. Rannals discussed the following with the board members:

- i) Harassment Prevention Training: all board members completed the required two-hour training; therefore, all are in compliance.
- ii) Employee Recognition Dinner: reminded the members of the dinner on April 22, 2017.
- iii) Photos: individual photos are needed for the new photo board. They were requested to have their picture taken April 24 at RSF4.







APRIL INCIDENT DISTRIBUTION






Pursuant to Government Code §7901, special districts may annually choose one of the following by a recorded vote of the governing body:

- 1. Cost of Living:
 - a. the change in California per capita personal income; or
 - b. the percentage change in the jurisdiction's assessed valuation, which is attributable to nonresidential new construction.

2. Population:

- a. the change in population within the county;
- b. the change in population within the unincorporated area of the county;
- the use of specific formula calculations or estimates, permitted for mixed incorporated/unincorporated areas of special districts and/or special districts serving more than one county; or

On July 22, 2016, the reorganization with CSA No. 107 (Elfin Forest/Harmony Grove) was completed and certified by the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). With the reorganization, as of January 1, 2017 and estimated population of 1,121 was added to the District. Unfortunately, the calculation for the Gann Limit is specific and staff is unable to combine the two census data pieces for a revised change in population. In order to take advantage of the larger change in census, the District thru the governing body must request the State of California Department of Finance (DOF) to prepare a special population change. The District will be required to reimburse the DOF the cost of preparing the estimate. A letter received by the DOF shows the cost estimated at \$1,500, and the requested documentation.

Each year special districts should perform necessary calculations to determine if year-end proceeds of taxes subject to the limit have exceeded the limit. Preliminary calculations have been made for all revenue received to determine whether this district complies with the appropriations limits established for the current fiscal year. Preliminary calculations show that the district will comply with the appropriation limit.

The following recommendation is submitted for your consideration and/or action:

- 1. To select the change in California per capital personal income (3.69%) for the Cost of Living Factor and the change in population within San Diego County average (.92%). (A copy of the State of California Department of Finance Price & Population Data for Local Jurisdictions is attached. *The District population provided by SANDAG is also included*
- 2. Determine that it is necessary that the Board choose to submit population documentation to State Department of Finance Demographic Research Unit for certification by June 1, 2017 to prepare an estimate of the annual percent change in population for the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District.
- 3. Authorize staff to execute a contract with the State of California Department of Finance to prepare and estimate of the annual percent change in population for a cost estimated at \$1,500.

Subject: Price Factor and Population Information

Appropriations Limit

The California Revenue and Taxation Code, section 2227, requires the Department of Finance (Finance) to transmit an estimate of the percentage change in population to local governments. Each local jurisdiction must use their percentage change in population factor for January 1, 2017, in conjunction with a change in the cost of living, or price factor, to calculate their appropriations limit for fiscal year 2017-18. Attachment A provides the change in California's per capita personal income and an example for utilizing the price factor and population percentage change factor to calculate the 2017-18 appropriations limit. Attachment B provides the city and unincorporated county population percentage change. Attachment C provides the population percentage change for counties and their summed incorporated areas. The population percentage change data excludes federal and state institutionalized populations and military populations.

Population Percent Change for Special Districts

Some special districts must establish an annual appropriations limit. The Revenue and Taxation Code, section 2228 provides additional information regarding the appropriations limit. Article XIII B, section 9(C) of the California Constitution exempts certain special districts from the appropriations limit calculation mandate. The Code and the California Constitution can be accessed at the following website: http://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/faces/codes.xhtml.

Special districts required by law to calculate their appropriations limit must present the calculation as part of their annual audit. Any questions special districts have on this requirement should be directed to their county, district legal counsel, or the law itself. No state agency reviews the local appropriations limits.

Population Certification

The population certification program applies only to cities and counties. Revenue and Taxation Code section 11005.6 mandates Finance to automatically certify any population estimate that exceeds the current certified population with the State Controller's Office. Finance will certify the higher estimate to the State Controller by June 1, 2017.

Please Note: Prior year's city population estimates may be revised.

A. **Price Factor**: Article XIII B specifies that local jurisdictions select their cost of living factor to compute their appropriation limit by a vote of their governing body. The cost of living factor provided here is per capita personal income. If the percentage change in per capita personal income is selected, the percentage change to be used in setting the fiscal year 2017-18 appropriation limit is:

Per Capita Personal Income

B. Following is an example using sample population change and the change in California per capita personal income as growth factors in computing a 2017-18 appropriation limit.

At your request and pursuant to Article XIIIB of the California Constitution, the State Department of Finance (Finance) will prepare an estimate of the annual percent change in population for your district if these two conditions are satisfied: 1) the data supplied by the special district are determined by Finance to be adequate for an estimate, and 2) both copies of the contract agreement enclosed are signed and returned. All data must be supplied to Finance by July 15 or Finance may decline to prepare an estimate. The change estimate will be for:

April 1, 2010 to January 1, 2017

You will be billed for the time required for this work. We estimate the cost to be either \$1,000 or \$1,500 depending on the information supplied. The estimate will be benchmarked to the April 1, 2010 census. We will use any relevant information we have available, but it will be the responsibility of the district to furnish all additional data. Finance's due date is September 1st to complete the estimate.

Please provide the following for your district:

A) With the release of the 2010 census, Finance must benchmark your district to the current population counts. As a result, we require that your district provide updated housing unit information or an indicator of change in residential housing units (i.e. final building permits) for the following periods:

April 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010

January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011

January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012

January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2013

January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2014

January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015

And

January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2016

We have in our files the number of housing units within each city and county, but we have no sub-county housing data within the unincorporated area or sub-city areas.

Potential sources for these data are city and county planning departments, the county assessor's office, or the local councils of government.

- B) You will need to supply maps showing 100 percent of your district drawn on them, in addition to providing the housing data requested in Section A. The price of the estimate will be determined by the method you choose to provide the geographical information to us. Below are the choices we will accept:
 - 1. GIS shape file of your district at 2010 Census block level. Cost of the 2010 benchmark and 2011 estimate = \$1,000.

- 2. Electronic or paper maps detailing the boundary of your district with 2010 Census geography including block detail. Cost of the 2010 benchmark and 2011 estimate = \$1,500.

Please do not include any areas outside your district, such as sphere of influence. Finance will provide a population change estimate only for the area within your district.
- D) If the information described in Section A is unavailable, a brief description of the annual records your district keeps, such as the number of residential service accounts, should be provided. The Lease was thereafter amended by a 1st Amendment dated May 1, 2015 (erroneously referred to as 2nd Lease Addendum) to provide for Lessee's lease of additional space for the installation and use of two microwave antennas (the "Antenna Space Lease") and an Amendment No. 2 dated April ____, 2016.
 - C. The parties now wish to amend the Lease as to the Antenna Space Lease.
- D. Lessor and Lessee now desire to enter into this Amendment No. 3 to amend the Lease as hereinafter provided.

AGREEMENT

- 1. Paragraph 68. Paragraph 68 is hereby deleted the following Paragraph 68 is added:
 - 68. <u>Term of Antenna Space</u>. The term of this short term lease of the Antenna Space shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing on June 1, 2017 and ending May 31, 2018.
- 2. Paragraph 69. Paragraph 69 is hereby deleted the following Paragraph 69 is added:
 - 69. Option to Renew Use of Antenna Space. Lessee has the option to extend this lease of the Antenna Space for one (1) addition year by giving Lessor written notice on or before April 1, 2018.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED and is hereby determined and ordered as follows:

- 1. That each and every charge set forth in said report is adopted;
- 2. That said reports are hereby confirmed;
- 3. That said reports as confirmed by this board be filed with the Auditor & Controller of the County of San Diego;
- 4. That said assessment shall appear as a separate item on tax bills entitled RSF Elfin Forest/Harmony Grove Fire Protection Assessment
- 5. The cost for fiscal year 2017/2018 shall be \$152.24 per benefit unit, a 1.97% increase;
- 6. This assessment applies to all applicable parcels in the following tax rate areas:
