To: Architects and Contractors Subject: Preliminary Plan Reviews

We would like to clarify the preliminary plan review process for the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District, Preliminary site plan reviews are defined as *conceptual* review of a site plan. The following items will be reviewed:

- Fire hydrant and fire flow
- Access (gates and driveways) length, width, grade, turnarounds, and surface material
- Hose Pull
- Building setback from top of slope
- Other fire and safety related site concerns

There is also a *conceptual* preliminary site plan review for landscape which includes the following:

- Access
- Landscape
- Vegetation clearance
- Fire code requirements

There are two separate fees associated with these plan reviews. The site plan review (Ordinance 1.15) is \$135.00. The site plan review for landscape (Ordinance 1.14) is \$110.00. These fees are separate due to the fact that they are routed to different plan checkers and they are looking at separate fire related issues for the project. All fees are due upon submittal to the Fire District and includes unlimited amount of re-submittals and/or stamp transfers for a single project.

These preliminary site plan reviews are NOT a substitution for a full set of County approved building, grading or landscape plans. These reviews are not required but recommended to help assist the property owner and the homeowner's association with the planning process. A full plan review will still be required for building and landscape and additional fees are associated with those services. The Fire District has a plan check turnaround of 10-15 business days; however, we make every attempt to review them before that time frame. We suggest that plans are submitted to the Fire District as soon as possible in order to meet any approaching deadlines
