#### 4. Oral Report

- a. Fire Chief Michel
  - i) Fairbanks Ranch Replacement Fire Station Update: Captain Galindo distributed an update on project. He reported that the contractor has given October 12, 2011 as the completion date for the project. He reviewed all of the work that is occurring concurrently to complete the project on the revised timeline. He also informed the Board that the District has received a "Public Works Stop Notice." The electrical subcontractor is in a dispute with the general contractor Ledcor. The District's legal counsel has been involved with this issue, and there has been communication between the District and subcontractor. A new electrical subcontractor is on site to continue the work. The interim station had to request an extension for its permit from the County, which the County has agreed to.
  - ii) Sharing of Resources with City of Encinitas: to date he has not received the necessary maps to analyze. A new date has yet to be determined for a governance meeting.
  - iii) District Activities
    - (1) Ice Cream Social October 13, 2011: to be held at the Fairbanks Ranch Clubhouse. A grant from Fireman's Fund will be awarded to the Fire District. All personnel are encouraged to attend.
    - (2) ISO Rating: the District has received the results of the recent evaluation. Although the report shows improvement, in particular the area of training; the rating remains a 4/9. He plans to prepare an analysis and present a report to the Board on a later date.
    - (3) 9-11 A Night of Hope: Horizon Christian Fellowship is organizing a 9-11 ceremony. The "Memorial Wall" that will be installed at the new station will be dedicated at the same event. All board members were encouraged to participate at the event.
- b. Operations Chief Ward
  - i) He summarized the following significant calls:
    - (1) Gas leak: 10 houses were evacuated as a result of a propane tank leak
    - (2) Structure fire: an apartment in a three-story apartment complex in the 4S Ranch area was damaged. Cause determined to be unattended cooking grease on the stove.
- c. Training Battalion Chief Davidson
  - i) Chief Davidson summarized the following training activity for all personnel:
    - (1) Electrical safety training provided by SDG&E
    - (2) Tabletop Exercise School Shooting –participants included CHP, Sheriff, RSF Association Patrol, and school officials
    - (3) Hose lays
- d. Fire Prevention Fire Marshal Hunter
  - i) New construction activity has slowed down considerably. He also updated the board on the weed abatement activity. The intern is continuing to work with the shelter-in-place communities and continues to obtain good compliance.
  - ii) He announced his retirement from the Fire District beginning October 1, 2011. He thanked the Board of Directors and staff for the opportunity to work for an organization that believes in being proactive in fire prevention.
- e. Administrative Manager Rannals
  - i) CalPERS Conference October 24 26, 2011: she reminded the board members for the upcoming conference. Director Hillgren agreed to attend the conference.
  - ii) She informed the board of her election to the Board of Directors for the International Association of Administrative Professional as President Elect.

The insurance company deemed the 2008 Expedition a total loss. The \$66,399 funding request may be less once the District can obtain a refined quote for installation of equipment and radios, however he requested authorization to proceed and authorize the purchase.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors accept the donation of a Sport Utility Vehicle (SUV) from San Diego Medical Services (SDMS) and authorize President to execute Vehicle Transfer Agreement.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On the April 13, 2011, the Board of Directors approved the position of the EMS Coordinator, which San Diego Medical Services (SDMS) previously employed this position. SDMS and/or the County of San Diego will reimburse the District the funding for this position. The EMS Coordinator is also provided a vehicle as the position requires transportation to cover the approximate 61 square miles and 12 fire stations within CSA-17.

#### **CURRENT SITUATION**

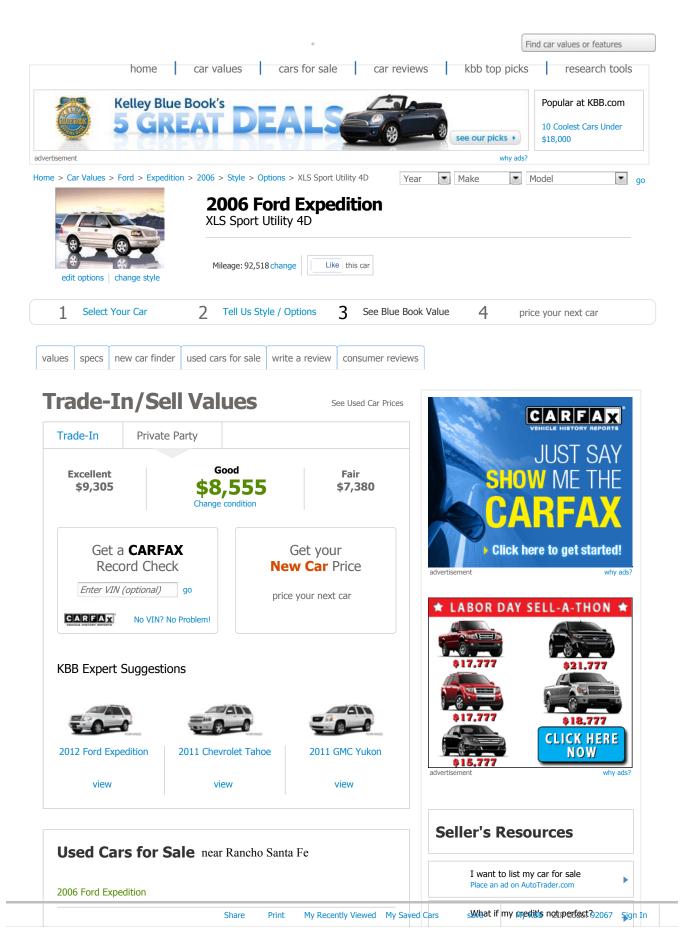
SDMS has notified the District that they are no longer able to insure the vehicle and any drivers employed by the District. After several discussions it was determined that, the transfer of ownership was to best solution, since the vehicle was purchased using SDMS funds. SDMS has agreed to this transfer ownership of the current EMS coordinator's vehicle to the RSFFPD.

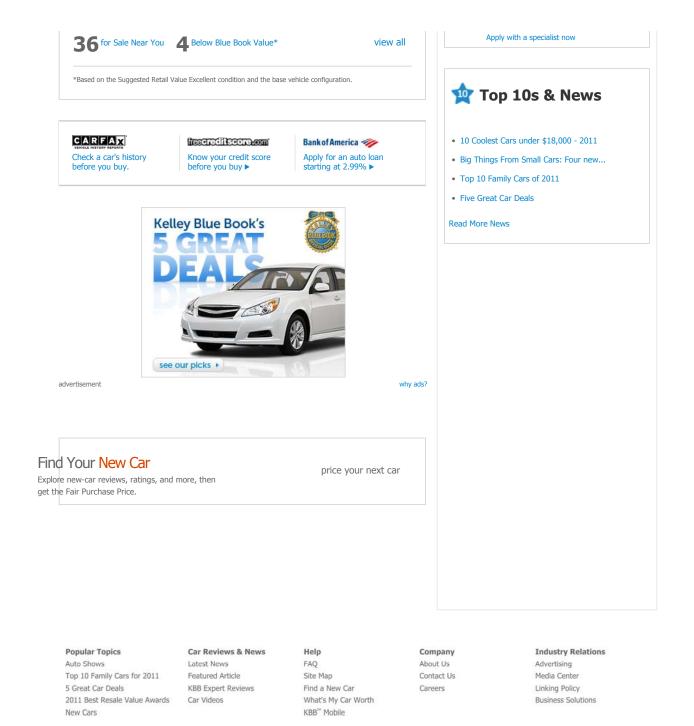
The Fire District has agreed to add the vehicle to the insurance policy for coverage. The cost of insurance will be reimbursed to the District from the EMS fund. In addition, under the new agreement, SDMS and/or the County of San Diego will continue to reimburse the District for fuel and maintenance costs of the vehicle.

A safety inspection of the vehicle will be conducted prior to the transfer of ownership. The agreed book value of the vehicle is \$8,555, which will be added to the District's fleet assets. The attached agreement has been reviewed and approved by the District's legal counsel.

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## VEHICLE TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This VEHICLE TRANSFER AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made on or as of this 24th day of Augus 7, 2011, (the "Effective Date") by and between SDMSE, LLC, a California limited liability company ("Transferor"), and Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District ("Recipient").
RECITALS
WHEREAS, Transferor is the owner of a certain supervisory vehicle, which is more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto; and
WHEREAS, as part of Transferor's agreement with Recipient to provide advanced life support paramedic services for CSA 17, Transferor must make available one vehicle for use by the EMS Coordinator;
WHEREAS, Transferor desires to transfer, and the Recipient desires to accept, the associated vehicle pursuant to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.
<b>NOW, THEREFORE</b> , in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:
1. <u>Agreement to Transfer</u> . Transferor agrees to transfer title and the Recipient agrees to accept all of Transferor's right, title, estate and interest in and to those items of personal property described on Exhibit A hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Property").
2. <u>Timing of Transfer</u> . The completion of the transactions contemplated hereby shall be effective at the time the parties execute this agreement and Recipient receives title.
3. Notices. Any notice, demand or communication required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below by any of the following means: (a) personal service; (b) facsimile; (c) overnight courier; or (d) registered or certified first class mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested:

4. <u>Governing Law</u>. The parties hereto expressly agree that the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and the subsequent performance hereunder, shall be construed and controlled in accordance with the laws of the State of California. If any court of competent jurisdiction is unable to construe any provision of this Agreement or holds any part thereof to be invalid, such holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.

### 5. <u>Entire Agreement; Disclaimer of Warranties; Limitation of Liabilities; Assumption of Liabilities; Release.</u>

- (a) This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto pertaining to the subject matter hereof (transfer of vehicle) and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. All prior and contemporaneous conversations, negotiations, possible and alleged agreements, representations, covenants and warranties concerning the subject matter hereof are merged herein. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except in writing signed by both parties hereto.
- (b) RECIPIENT ACKNOWLEDGES THAT, EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT, NEITHER TRANSFEROR NOR ANYONE ACTING FOR OR ON BEHALF OF TRANSFEROR HAS MADE ANY REPRESENTATION, STATEMENT, WARRANTY OR PROMISE TO RECIPIENT, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, ARISING BY LAW OR OTHERWISE CONCERNING THE CONVEYANCE OF THE PROPERTY, THE PHYSICAL ASPECTS AND CONDITION OF ANY OF THE PROPERTY WHICH IS THE SUBJECT OF THIS AGREEMENT, ANY SPECIFICATIONS OF ANY OF THE PROPERTY, THE FEASIBILITY, APPLICABILITY, OR APPROPRIATENESS OF ANY OF THE PROPERTY FOR ANY PARTICULAR USE; AND THAT IN ENTERING INTO THIS AGREEMENT, RECIPIENT HAS NOT RELIED ON ANY REPRESENTATION, STATEMENT OR WARRANTY OF TRANSFEROR (EXCEPT THOSE EXPRESSLY CONTAINED IN SECTION 4 OF THIS

AGREEMENT), OR ANYONE ACTING FOR OR ON BEHALF OF TRANSFEROR; AND THAT RECIPIENT IS ACCEPTING DONATION OF THE PROPERTY ON ITS OWN INSPECTION AND EXAMINATION THEREOF; AND THAT RECIPIENT IS ACCEPTING DONATION OF SUCH PROPERTY ON THE CLOSING DATE IN ITS THEN "AS IS" AND "WHERE IS" PHYSICAL CONDITION AND ITS THEN "AS IS" AND "WHERE IS" STATE OF REPAIR WITH ALL FAULTS AND WITHOUT RECOURSE AGAINST TRANSFEROR; AND THAT RECIPIENT DOES HEREBY WAIVE, AND TRANSFEROR DOES HEREBY DISCLAIM, ALL WARRANTIES OF ANY TYPE OR KIND WHATSOEVER WITH RESPECT TO THE PROPERTY. INCLUDING, BY WAY OF DESCRIPTION, BUT NOT LIMITATION, THOSE OF FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, MERCHANTABILITY AND WITHOUT LIMITING THE FOREGOING, AND EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED IN THIS AGREEMENT, TRANSFEROR SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO RECIPIENT OR ANY THIRD PARTY FOR ANY DAMAGE OR LOSS (INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO LIABILITIES, COSTS AND EXPENSES) ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT OR THE TRANSACTIONS CONTEMPLATED HEREBY, WHETHER IN CONTRACT OR IN TORT, OR BY REASON OF ANY LOCAL. STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS OR REGULATIONS. IN NO EVENT SHALL TRANSFEROR BE LIABLE FOR INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, EVEN IF TRANSFEROR HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.

- (c) Recipient waives any claim for damages because of defects, whether known or unknown.
- (d) Recipient acknowledges that it is entering into this Agreement on the basis of Recipient's own investigation of the condition of the Property and Recipient assumes the risk that adverse conditions may not have been revealed by its investigation.
- (e) Recipient waives the right to recover from Transferor and its directors, officers, employees and agents any and all damages, losses, liabilities, costs or expenses whatsoever (including, reasonable attorney fees), and claims therefore, whether direct or indirect known or unknown, foreseen or unforeseen, which may arise on account of or in any way growing out of or connected with the condition of the Property or any environmental condition affecting the Property.
- (f) As additional consideration, as of the Closing, Recipient assumes liability for, and forever releases and agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Transferor harmless from, all claims arising from and after the Closing Date relating to the ownership, use, misuse, possession or condition of the Property, regardless of whether (i) such claim is brought against Recipient or Transferor, or (ii) such

circumstances, events, actions or claims are foreseeable or unforeseeable, known or unknown, contingent or otherwise (the "Assumed Liabilities"). Without limiting the foregoing, the Assumed Liabilities include, (1) any liability for injury to any person, property or otherwise resulting from the use or misuse of the property, (2) any liabilities under any federal, state or local law or regulation, and (3) any product liability or similar claims relating to the Property or any component thereof.

- (g) The provisions of Section 5 shall survive the transfer of the vehicle.
- 6. <u>Assignment</u>. This Agreement may not be assigned by the Recipient without the express written consent of the Transferor, which consent may be withheld in Transferor's sole discretion.

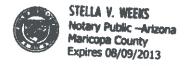

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors approve a Major Use Permit Modification to the existing Verizon Wireless Communications Facility located within Rancho Santa Fe Fire Station One and to authorize the Board President to sign a Major Use Permit agreement issued by the San Diego County Department of Planning and Land Use.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On July 22, 1994, the San Diego County Planning Commission ("County") granted a Major Use Permit to Airtouch Cellular for a wireless communications facility located within the existing Rancho Santa Fe Fire Station One building.

On October 18, 1994, the District entered into an agreement with Airtouch Cellular d/b/a Verizon Wireless to lease a portion of the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Station One building to construct, operate and maintain a wireless communications facility that would include the required antennas, equipment and support structures.

At present, Verizon Wireless has (2) Omni whip antennas and (1) GPS antenna mounted on a 35 foot tall monopole and a unmanned wireless telecommunication complex operating within a 220 square-foot equipment room located on the second floor of the fire station.

#### **CURRENT SITUATION**

Verizon Wireless has submitted a request to the "County" to modify its original Major Use Permit in order to reconfigure the existing Omni whip antennas and add two additional antennas (for a total of 5 antennas) to the existing roof-mounted monopole (see photo simulations of existing and proposed configuration, attachment 1a - 1c). There are no other proposed changes to the size or location of the existing equipment room located on the second floor of the fire station.

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the proposed project was also circulated to various agencies for environmental review. Based on the assessment of the

project as proposed, A Notice of Determination was issued by the "County" indicating that the project will have no harmful effects to the environment.

On July 8, 2011, the Planning Commission approved Verizon's request for a Major Use Permit Modification, No. 3301-94-013-03 (attachment 2), which further granted a specific exemption pursuant to Zoning Ordinance Section 4620(g) to allow the height of the monopole to be 67 feet where the maximum is currently 35 feet.

A Covenant Agreement (attachment 3) was issued by the "County" to the District for formal authorization and forwarded to the District's legal counsel, Stephen J. Fitch for review. Mr. Fitch concurs with the agreement and recommends Board approval.

On July 8, 2011, the San Diego County Planning Commission considered your request for approval of the above-referenced Major Use Permit Modification (P93-013W³), which would allow reconfiguration of an existing omni-whip antenna by adding two additional omni-whip antennas (for a total of five) to the existing roof-mounted monopole at the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District Fire Station Number 1. One GPS antenna is also proposed to be mounted on the existing 55′ tall monopole frame. No changes to the size or location of the existing equipment room, located on the second floor of the Fire Station, are proposed. The existing facility currently occupies approximately 20 square feet of the 0.6-acre parcel, which is located at 16936 El Fuego Road in the San Dieguito Community Plan Area.

By a vote of 5-0 (one abstention and one absence), the Planning Commission approved P94-013W<sup>3</sup>. SUBJECT: SHARED FIREFIGHTER RESOURCE POOL MEMORANDUM OF

**UNDERSTANDING** 

**DATE:** SEPTEMBER 9, 2011



#### RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully requested that the Board of Directors authorize the Board President to execute the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) creating a firefighter resource pool for the purpose of meeting staffing requirements of paramedic engines and paramedic ambulances.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Agencies within the Fire Management Services Agreement (City of Encinitas, City of Del Mar, and City of Solana Beach) have agreed to participate in a Shared Resource Pool in which firefighters (including firefighter/paramedics, engineers, and captains) of each member agency will be available to be used by other member agencies to meet staffing needs on paramedic engines and ambulances. Staff recommends the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District sign on to the resource pool as a member agency to meet the staffing requirements of paramedic engines and ambulances and to provide cross training of employees to enhance the overall efficiency of fire services in San Diego County.

#### **CURRENT SITUATION**

On occasion, vacation, vacancies, training, sick, workers compensation or other types of paid or unpaid leave, may tax an individual department's ability to provide adequate staffing on paramedic engines or ambulances. The creation of a shared resource pool will allow member agencies access to a larger pool of qualified employees to assist in meeting their staffing requirements before forcing back firefighters or having employees work an excessive number of hours. It will also facilitate the cross training of employees, thereby enhancing the overall efficiency and effectiveness of fire services provided by the member agencies.

Staff from the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District, City of Encinitas, City of Del Mar, and City of Solana Beach have agreed to a draft MOU establishing a resource pool (included as Attachment A). Note that District's legal counsel has reviewed and concurred with the attached MOU.

The District has met and conferred with the Rancho Santa Fe Firefighters Association, and the Association has agreed to participate in the resource pool if the MOU is approved by the Board of Directors. Each firefighter/paramedic designated by the member agency under the MOU will remain a full time employee of that member. The performance of duties would be the same as would occur pursuant to a mutual aid response between members. A member agency whose paramedic/firefighter has been utilized from the resource pool (pursuant with the MOU) will invoice the other member that

utilized the responding firefighter/paramedic for the actual costs incurred by the member agency (employer), including overtime and the employer portion of all state, federal and local employee taxes. The Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District has been designated as the lead agency for the purposes of compiling and disseminating the list of qualified firefighters in the resource pool. Any member agency can elect to terminate its participation in the MOU upon written notification to the other members. The MOU shall automatically terminate if, at any time, fewer than two members are party to the MOU.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

**THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** ("MOU") is made by and among the public agencies (hereinafter "Members" and individually "Member") that are signatories to this MOU.

#### **RECITALS**

- I. Each Member currently provides services to the public within its jurisdiction consisting of fire protection, fire suppression and emergency medical services ("Services").
- II. Each Member as part of its Services operates one or more paramedic engines, which require at minimum one crew person to be a certified paramedic/firefighter, engineer, and captain at all times.
- III. Currently Members experience times whereby their agency faces a shortage of qualified paramedic/firefighters, engineers, or captains.
- IV. Each Member desires to participate in a "firefighter resource pool" under this MOU whereby firefighters of each Member will be available to be used by other Members to meet staffing needs on paramedic engines and ambulances. "Firefighter" includes qualified paramedic/firefighters, and captains. The classification of Engineer is excluded from the firefighter resource pool.
- V. The Members agree among themselves that it will be to their mutual benefit for all Members to participate in this firefighter resource pool not only to meet future staffing needs but to provide for cross training of employees to enhance the overall efficiency of fire service in San Diego County.

#### **AGREEMENT**

In consideration of the mutual promises and obligations set forth below and other valuable considerations of sufficiency and receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by all Members, the Members agree as follows:

- 1. Purpose of this Agreement. The purpose of this MOU is to create a firefighter resource pool consisting of qualified firefighters of each Member who shall in accordance with the terms of this MOU be utilized by other Members for the purposes of meeting staffing requirements of paramedic engines and paramedic ambulances.
- **2.** <u>Implementation.</u> In order to implement the terms of this MOU the following matters shall be required of with by each Member:

- a. Each Member shall address the meet and confer expectations and requirements with their collective bargaining unit representing firefighters of that Member prior to executing this MOU. Said meet and confer shall be for the purposes of those firefighters manning shifts as paramedic/firefighters or captains of other Members to this MOU. It is anticipated that subsequent to the adoption of this MOU, management representatives of the respective agencies will unilaterally develop, adopt, and promulgate implementing policies, rules, procedures and practices affecting their agency's participation in this mutual assistance agreement.
- b. Each firefighter designated by a Member under this MOU is and shall remain a full time employee of that Member ("Employer Member") and shall have been a full time firefighter for a minimum of one year.
- c. Employer Member shall have the sole responsibility for paying the salaries and taxes to include, but not limited to, federal social security taxes, federal, state and local employment taxes and other employee related expenses, including, but not limited to workers compensation insurance, health coverage and retirement benefits regarding such firefighter. Nothing contained in this MOU shall be deemed to create an employee/employer relationship between the firefighter and any Member utilizing said firefighter pursuant to this MOU.
- d. In performing the duties of a firefighter under this MOU, said firefighter shall be under the direction of the Captain or Senior Officer of the Member requesting from the firefighter resource pool. This direction shall be the same as would occur pursuant to a mutual aid response between the Members.
- e. In performing services under this MOU each Member agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and county statutes, ordinances and regulations.
- f. Each participating firefighter will utilize the safety gear, breathing apparatus mask and spare breathing apparatus bottles from their Employer Member when assigned to any other Member. It shall be the responsibility of the individual firefighter to transport and return all personal safety equipment to the appropriate work site.
- g. All participating firefighters will be compensated at an over-time rate of 1½ times their regular rate as currently earned from the Employer Member.
- 3. <u>Pool Coverage</u>. Each Member shall designate its Fire Chief or other

appropriate senior officer to prepare on an annual basis a list of firefighters of that Member who are available to participate under the firefighter resource pool pursuant to this MOU. Said list shall then be faxed or e-mailed to the Lead Agency, as defined below. Any Member shall be allowed to pull from that firefighter resource pool once they have exhausted their own internal resources as to firefighters.

- 4. Payment for Coverage. A Member whose firefighter has been utilized pursuant to this MOU shall invoice the other Member utilizing responding firefighter for the actual costs of that Employer Member (including overtime rate times number of hours worked), as well as the employer portion of all state, federal and local employee taxes, including, but not limited to Medicare and Social Security. Invoices sent to a Member by another Member shall be paid quarterly. Failure to pay any valid and accurate invoice within said time may result in that Member no longer being able to participate in the firefighter resource pool under this MOU.
- **5.** <u>Insurance</u>. Each Member shall keep in full force and effect during all times of this MOU the following insurance:
  - a. Worker's Compensation Insurance with a waiver of subrogation covering all employees of Member participating in the firefighter resource pool;
  - b. Comprehensive Liability Insurance to include general liability, automotive liability and public officials and professional liability. Each policy shall provide coverage for bodily injury and property damage in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limit per occurrence. Should said Member fail to maintain said insurance, they shall automatically be removed from participation under this MOU;
  - c. Each agency may be self-insured to satisfy these insurance requirements.
- 6. <u>Lead Agency</u>. Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District is designated the lead agency ("Lead Agency") for the purposes of this MOU. The Lead Agency is authorized to act on behalf of the Members to receive and disseminate on an annual basis the firefighter resource pool of qualified firefighters under this MOU. Said firefighter resource pool shall than be transmitted via facsimile or e-mail to each Member. It shall be the sole responsibility of the requesting Member to contact directly the firefighter to be utilized under this MOU. After a firefighter has completed a shift under this MOU the requesting Member shall immediately notify the Employer Member of the name of the firefighter who worked, the date worked and the number of shifts, or hours worked.
- **7. Effective Date.** This MOU shall be effective on the date approved and executed by all Members.
- **8.** <u>Term Voluntary Termination.</u> From the date it becomes effective the MOU shall remain in continuous effect until terminated. This MOU shall automatically terminate if at

any time there are fewer than two (2) Members.

- **9.** <u>Voluntary Termination</u>. Any Member may elect to terminate its participation under this MOU upon written notice to the other Members. Said termination shall not relieve the Member from liability for payment of all sums owed other Members pursuant to this MOU.
- **10.** <u>Amendments.</u> This MOU may be amended or modified but only by written instrument duly approved and executed by an authorized representative of each Member.
- 11. <u>Counterpart Signatures</u>. This MOU may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one instrument.
- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. Each Member agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other Members and their officers, agents, representatives, sub-contractors, volunteers or employees from any and against all expenses, costs including but not limited to attorneys fees and disbursements, losses or liabilities, including any liabilities loss or claim or third party claims arising out of claim or loss alleged to have risen out of or resulting from claims by the Members employee from injury or accident resulting from their participation in the firefighter resource pool. This indemnification shall survive the termination of this MOU.
- 13, Sole Agreement. The Members agree that this MOU constitutes the sole and only agreement between the parties regarding the firefighter resource pool.
- **14.** Governing Law. This MOU shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws in the State of California.
  - **15.** <u>Time is of the Essence.</u> Time is expressly of the essence.

By our letter of April 18, 2011, we solicited nominations for one LAFCO alternate Special District member and nine positions on the Special Districts Advisory Committee with one short-term expiring in 2012. By the deadline of June 3, 2011, three nominations for the alternate Commission member, and eight nominations for nine positions on the Advisory Committee were received. Because fewer nominations were submitted for the nine available positions on the Advisory Committee, Write-In nominations are encouraged. The candidate with the ninth highest number of votes will receive a term on the Advisory Committee expiring in 2012. The terms for the other eight positions are for four-years. As required by the Selection Committee Rules, all eligible nominations were forwarded to the Nominating Committee. The 2011 Nominating Committee was comprised of Larry Jackman (San Miguel Consolidated Fire Protection District), Dennis Shepard (North County Cemetery District), and Gary Arant (Valley Center Municipal Water District). LAFCO Consultant Harry Ehrlich met with the Nominating Committee to discuss a recommended slate of nominees for the open positions. A copy of the Nominating Committee's Report and Recommendations is attached (Attachment 1). Special District Election Ballot and Vote Certifications form on which to record your votes (Attachment 2). A list of the eligible independent special districts is provided for your convenience (Attachment 3). Please note that LAFCO staff has not included any of the candidates' promotional materials with the election materials. Lastly, attached are the Special District Summary of Nominations and copies of Nomination Forms (Attachment 4).

With respect to ballots, there is a separate ballot for each position: yellow for the LAFCO alternate special district member, and blue for the advisory committee members. Be sure each ballot is marked only for the number of positions to be voted for in that category. A ballot that is cast for more than the indicated number of positions will be disregarded.

The ballots should be considered by your full district board. State Law and the Selection Committee Rules require a district's vote to be cast by its presiding officer, or an alternate member of the legislative body appointed by the other members. Therefore, the certification form has been incorporated with the ballot forms to be signed by the person who casts your district's votes. A ballot received without a signed certification form will <u>not</u> be counted.

All nominees are listed on the relevant ballot. An asterisk indicates the nominating committee recommendations, and incumbents have been *italicized*. Write-in candidates are permitted, and spaces have been provided for that purpose.

The deadline for receipt of the ballots by LAFCO is <u>October 21, 2011</u>. The Selection Committee Rules require that marked ballots be returned <u>by certified mail, return receipt requested</u>. Facsimile (FAX) ballots and certification forms will be accepted, <u>if necessary to meet the ballot deadline</u>, but originals must be submitted as soon as possible thereafter.

The Selection Committee Rules stipulate that a majority of the districts shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of committee business. There are 61 independent special districts in the county; therefore, a minimum of <u>31</u> ballots must be received to certify that a legal election was conducted. A candidate for a LAFCO member must receive at least a majority of the votes cast to be elected. Election to the Special Districts Advisory Committee requires only a plurality vote. The ballots will be kept on file in this office, and will be made available upon request.

Harry Mathis Public Member In 2011, independent special district nominations were solicited for: (1) one alternate member on LAFCO with a term expiring in 2015, and (2) nine Special Districts Advisory Committee members with eight terms expiring in 2015 and one with a term expiring in 2012. By the deadline of June 3, 3011, our office received three nominations for the LAFCO alternate member position, and eight nominations for the nine Special Districts Advisory Committee positions.

As required by the Selection Committee Rules, a nominating committee was appointed to review the nominations submitted, and to prepare a list of recommended candidates. According to the Selection Committee Rules, the nominating committee is appointed by the chairperson or vice chair of the Special Districts Advisory Committee. LAFCO Consultant Harry Ehrlich scheduled a meeting on August 23rd with nominating committee members Larry Jackman (San Miguel Consolidated Fire Protection District), Dennis Shepard (North County Cemetery District), and Gary Arant (Valley Center Municipal Water District). In evaluating the nominations, the committee considered special district experience, interest, and knowledge of LAFCO issues. For those nominees who are incumbents, the committee further considered attendance records and participation. The committee also wanted representation from those types of districts that most often are involved in making recommendations to LAFCO. Since there were only eight nominations for the nine Advisory Committee positions, the nominating committee encourages the nomination of Write-In candidates. The top eight vote getters will receive four-year terms and the ninth highest vote getter will receive a one-year term. The nominating committee's recommendation for each category follows:

# Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District Final Budget – FY12

The Fire District proposed Operating and Capital Replacement Budget for FY12 is submitted to the Board of Directors for its review and consideration. The annual budget is the most significant tool available to the District to set priorities for the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District over the next year and beyond. This narrative is intended to demonstrate that the District is fiscally prudent in proposing the necessary revenue and expenditures, while providing the highest level of emergency response, fire prevention, and administrative services.

In analyzing the FY12 budget, you will notice that the estimated costs are higher than monies truly spent in FY11 (7.4% or \$792,000). The largest category to increase is personnel costs. Further explanation will be offered later in this narrative. Due to the current financial conditions, staff has continued to work diligently to maintain costs with minimal increases to the budget.

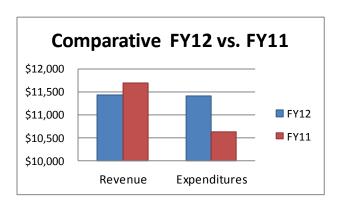
This budget provides "higher level" summary information and an accumulated depreciation schedule.

#### **Overview**

The budget overview compares the proposed FY12 budget to actual FY11 expenditures with an increase

of 7.4%; however, the proposed FY12 budget compared to FY11 final budget is an increase of 3.6%.

This year we are requesting a FY12 Operating Budget of \$11,419 (in thousands), which includes \$755 for Depreciation Expenses. The District also included a full year of revenue and expense for personnel associated with the cooperative effort with the cities of Del Mar, Encinitas, and Solana Beach.



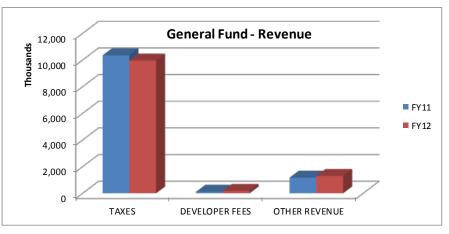
# **Projected Revenues**

The projected revenue compares the proposed FY 12 budget to actual FY11 revenues. We are projecting general fund revenues of \$11,444, which is a decrease of -2.1% (\$249) over last year's audited revenues. These projected revenues do provide \$25 revenue over expenditure base for the full budget. The following is a summary highlighting changes between the budgets:

#### Revenue- \$11,444

Taxes & Assessments - $\sqrt{3.1\%}$  (\$316,000): tax revenue has continued to decline because of the Districts' declining assessed valuation and the significant refunds of property taxes collected in prior years.

Lease -  $\uparrow$  34.9% (\$77,772) in addition to the CPI increase (1.3%), the



District has a lease for space vacated at RSF1 when the administrative offices relocated to Rancho Cielo.

Administrative Fees -  $\uparrow$  (\$269,500): in addition to the CPI increase (1.3%), the District has added a full year Training Officer to the Battalion Chief positions provided in the cooperative efforts (\$72,500), and reimbursements for the EMS Coordinator position (\$119,000).

In addition to these general funds, we are estimating that we will collect \$353 in restricted Fire Mitigation Fees and interest on these funds. We propose to expend \$1,802 of these restricted funds to complete the construction of the replacement fire station for Fairbanks Ranch.

# **Projected Operating Expenditures**

The projected operating expenditure compares the proposed FY 12 budget to the approved FY11 expenditures. Many of the operating expenditures are based upon historical data over a three-year period.

The following is a summary of the expenditure changes between this budget, and the FY11 budget:

#### **Personnel - \$9,072**

Personnel costs increased 3.9% (\$342,500) over FY11 expenses. The primary changes are:

Salary- $\sqrt{2}$ : two positions were not funded, which include a Fire Prevention Specialist and Deputy Chief positions. A new position EMS Coordinator was added with 100% funding from the CSA-17 contract (\$119,000).

Management Services (Coop Eff.)- ←: this new category (\$233,871) represents the costs associated with the services provided by three deputy chiefs from the City of Encinitas and City of Solana Beach.

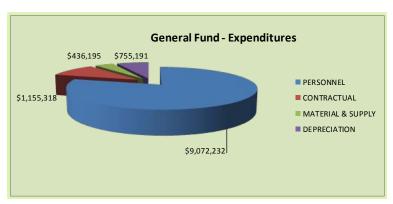
Overtime- $\sqrt{4.2\%}$ : this decrease is due primarily to the decrease in average hours for call back pay. The overtime analysis is also for a three-year period.

Health Insurance & HRSA (Health Retirement Savings Account) -↑ 1.1%: the District experienced a 9.5% increase in health insurance rates, which is shared 50/50 with the employees.

Unemployment Insurance -↑ 11.3%: this is due to a rate increase established by the State.

# Contractual Services – \$1,155

The Contractual Services category increased 11.8% (\$121,523) over FY11. This increase is primarily in the following areas: administrative fees, resulting in increased fees with the County of San



Diego; dispatching; and utilities (electricity, water, sewer, trash) resulting from the additional location.

### Material & Supply - \$436

The Material and Supply category decreased by -32.7% (\$211,548) over FY11. The primary reason for the decrease is the one-time purchase of breathing apparatus in the safety account. Other significant increases include computers (\$12,100) that includes the purchase of replacement laptops, which were deferred in FY11, medical supplies (16,740) and fuel (\$7,092).

### **Depreciation - \$755**

The depreciation expense increased 13.8% (\$91,651). This increase is due primarily to the purchase of the new administrative office and  $\frac{1}{2}$  year for the replacement of the Fairbanks Ranch Fire Station.

# **Capital Expenditures**

The District's expenditures for Equipment, Facility, and Fleet replacement total \$2,598,000. There is one major project anticipated for the FY12 year, which is the completion of the Fairbanks Ranch Fire Station. The major funding source is using Fire Mitigation Fees, which are monies collected by the County on new construction and provided to the District for funding of capital facilities that are necessary due to growth. In addition, three new vehicles are planned for replacement.

# **Budget Summary**

District personnel continually evaluate and monitor all revenues and expenditures without affecting the high level of service we provide to the community. In our third year of participating in the cooperative efforts, an additional source of revenue was realized, while obtaining the services of two additional deputy chiefs. With the purchase of the new administration building, the District will benefit from lease revenue generated from the vacated space at RSF1. However, continued care must be given to ensure that declining revenues and rising expenditures remain balanced.

The management staff has been proactive and is to be commended for their tireless and continued efforts in both research and preparation of the budget document.

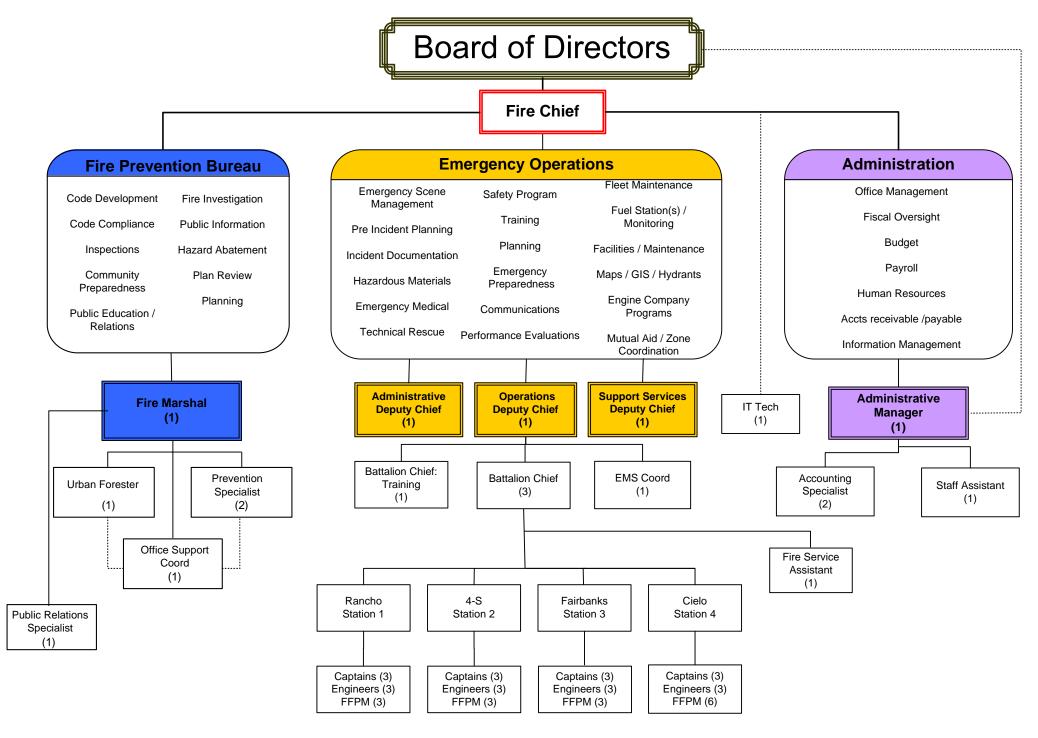

#### **RESOLUTION No. 2011-06**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE RANCHO SANTA FE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT ADOPTING THE FIRE MITIGATION FEE FUND MULTI-YEAR PLAN

**WHEREAS**, the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District participates in the San Diego County Fire Mitigation Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of San Diego is empowered to collect mitigation fees from applicants for new development for the purpose of the expansion of fire protection and firefighting facilities and equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District must annually adopt a Fire Mitigation Fee Fund Multi-Year Plan at a noticed public hearing.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- (1) The Fire Mitigation Fee Fund Multi-Year Plan was incorporated as a part of the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District Final Budget for fiscal year 2011/12.
- (2) A noticed public hearing for adoption of the Final Budget FY 2011/12 was held on September 21, 2011.
