RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends acceptance of the Staffing for Adequate Fire & Emergency Response Grant #EMW-2016-FF-00069 which provides for the salary and benefits for a full-time volunteer recruitment and retention coordinator, costs for basic firefighter training, tuition assistance for higher education, and NFPA 1582 entry-level physicals for new volunteer members for a period of four (4) years.

BACKGROUND

In 2016/17, the Department of Homeland Security and the Federal Emergency Management Agency opened grant applications under two programs:

- Staffing for Adequate Fire & Emergency Response (SAFER)
- Assistance for Firefighters (AFG).

The Fire District submitted four (4) grants applications, two (2) under SAFER which typically provides funding for staffing, and two (2) under Assistance Firefighter Grants (AFG), which usually funds equipment requests.

On July 28, 2017, the Fire District received notice that the District was awarded SAFER Grant #EMW-2016-FH-00203, in which we will hire three (3) firefighter paramedics for RSF6. On September 1, 2017, the District received notification our SAFER Grant application # EMW-2016-FF-00069 was also approved. This grant is a four (4) year program with a total of \$622,931 in grant funding. Under this award, there is no District cost share or matching funds required.

CURRENT SITUATION

When the Fire District reorganized with CSA 107, it took on the added responsibility of managing a volunteer fire station. While SAFER EMW-2016-FH-00203 will provide assistance by providing limited career staffing, RSF6 will require the utilization of volunteer firefighters to make up the full crew compliment of three or four firefighters on duty for many years.

The District is having a very difficult time in retaining trained volunteer firefighters due to the high demand and hiring of career firefighters at the local, state, and federal levels.

ANALYSIS / DISCUSSION

The SAFER grant award presents an exceptional opportunity for the District to dramatically improve and stabilize our current volunteer program. The temporary full-time appointment of a Volunteer Recruitment and Retention Coordinator would reduce the impact on current staff and maximize opportunities by developing, leading, and implementing comprehensive and effective program that will attract and retain qualified volunteers to the District.

The training and educational assistance will improve retention of current volunteer firefighters and will be a means to attract high quality fire service orientated candidates. Another advantage of the training and education funds is the potential to assist financially disadvantaged candidates through fire academy or paramedic school.

Finally, the funding provided under new member costs will provide for sixteen to eighteen National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1582 entry-level physicals per year. This is the typical number of physicals given for new members annually. This will be a huge improvement over the Department of Transportation (DOT) MCSA 5876 physical the District currently provides. A Department of Transportation physical concentrates on ensuring an employee is physically capable of operating a commercial vehicle; whereas an NPFA physical exam focuses on the ability perform fire service tasks based on job analysis and includes a twelve lead cardiac screen.

The District, by accepting this grant, should not anticipate any significant expenditures of District funds.

- (3) A copy of the Fire Mitigation Fee Fund Multi-Year Facilities and Equipment Plan is included as a part of this resolution.
